

Team Dentist Course, June 22, 2011

Introduction:

As the fields of sports medicine and sports dentistry evolve, so too does the role and responsibilities of the **Team Dentist**. The clinician requires sport specific knowledge and special training in order to work to his or her capacity in amateur or professional sporting events. In the Academy we feel that this course will help the practitioners carry out their responsibilities in an appropriate manner.

This course is primarily designed to meet the educational needs of clinical dentists from all fields of dentistry who care for and participate in sports teams as part of their practice. With the completion of the **ASD Team Dentist Course** the clinician will have been presented with the information needed to perform his or her duties as a team dentist.

The responsibilities of a “**Team Dentist**” may include:

1. Organizing dental care for a specific team.
2. Delivering dental care to the athletes:
3. Pre-participation dental exam and medical history.
4. Treatment of dental conditions and injuries with return to activity recommendation.
5. Identification and proper referral of psychological and drug problems.
6. Participating in the development of a mouthguard program.
7. Providing coverage for games and other sports competition.

Course Objectives:

Provide information needed to become and carry out your role as a team dentist.
Identify specific situations and problems encountered in various sports (baseball, football, hockey, boxing, etc.).
Explain the basic principles of prevention of dental injuries.
Understand the guidelines for, and be able to fabricate a properly fitted mouthguard.
Identify and provide diagnosis and treatment of various dental problems of the athletes including those in active competition.
Identify the role of therapeutic drugs, performance-enhancing drugs and recognize drug abuse in sports.

Course Description:

This course is intended to provide additional knowledge to the dentist in a sports-related environment. Clinicians interested in learning the basic information necessary to perform the duties of a “**Team Dentist**” along with the responsibilities of the dentist as a member of the medical service team will be discussed. Upon the completion of this program the dentist will receive verification from the ASD for 8 hours of continuing education credits.

 Dr. Hoy will present the various classifications of traumatic dental injuries with examples. In addition he will review treatment options for more complicated dental injuries including, initial treatment, interim treatment, definitive treatment and follow-up.

 At the conclusion of the presentation attendees will be able to identify & classify various types of traumatic dental injuries. They will also be able to identify various treatment options for more complicated dental injuries and identify the proper follow-up following a traumatic dental injuries.

- 4:00 pm- 5:30 pm** **Lecture: Major Cosmetic Restoration of Severely Traumatized Teeth** **Speaker: Brett Dorney, BDS, FASD**
 This lecture will focus on correct diagnosis of the damaged tissues, immediate and long term term goals and an understanding of possible complications. Dental trauma will be classified as either acute, requiring immediate treatment, sub acute with treatment occurring within 24 hours and delayed where treatment is after 24 hours. Some of the cases shown will have a 15 year history while the more recent cases will show the benefit of evidence based treatment.

 The challenges of treating severe Dental trauma are to restore normal aesthetics and function. Where that is not possible modern restorative materials and implants must be incorporated into the treatment plan. A distinction must be made between healing and repair. Many cases that I have treated will demonstrate how to deal with the most severe

traumas that could be treated in general Dental practice .The website www.dentaltraumaguide.org is a visualization of the IADT (International Association of Dental Trauma) trauma guidelines. It looks at Dental trauma in the permanent dentition but this lecture will also cover trauma to the primary dentition. There is definitely an increase in the number and severity of Dental trauma requiring treatment in general practice. This lecture will assist you in decision making and treatment for Dental trauma victims from age 3 to age 80.

Speaker: Gerald Maher, DMD
 Concussions have long been treated after they occur with little attention being given to prevention. Mouthguards and custom fitted orthotics should be based on dental anatomy and TMJ Biomechanics. The head, neck and jaw work as a unit. Dr. Maher's theories are based on 38 years treating TMD patients.

 Dental anatomy, occlusion, collapsed vertical dimension, clenching, grinding and TMJ pathology all influence jaw position and splint thickness. Dental principles must be followed when an appliance is inserted. The dentist must know where he is placing the jaw. This position is not centric occlusion. If you move the jaw incorrectly you will cause more harm than good.

The use of smokeless tobacco among professional baseball players, concerns that these baseball players are “role models” and research investigations regarding the harmful effects of “spit” tobacco use among professional baseball player were funded, heightened, and peaked between 1985 and 1995. While campaigns by the National Spit Tobacco Educational Program (NSTEP) which are supported by PBATS, the NATA and the NCAA remain active, there appears to be a general “lack of interest” and “denial” of the use of “spit” tobacco by members of the dental and medical professions. Additionally, health educators and school administrators at the high school and collegiate level as well as minor league baseball administrators have adopted a similar level of apathy and disinterest. The presentation will provide a comprehensive update and review and demonstrate why the topic of “spit tobacco” needs to be of a constant paramount focus by the sports dentist.

Following this presentation, the attendee should be able to understand and discuss the emergence of a silent epidemic in high school and the profile of the adolescent athletic.

In addition they should understand the demographics of “Spit Tobacco” lesions. The increase of “Spit Tobacco” use among baseball players and in football.

The Dentition**
Speaker: Brett Dorney, BDS, FASD
This lecture will challenge the marketed benefits of sports drinks, discuss their ingredients, look at the defense mechanisms in the oral cavity, investigate hydration and show numerous cases of young athletes teeth damaged through erosion and attrition.

The need for carbohydrate and electrolytes replacement depends on exercise intensity, duration, weather and individual differences in sweat rate. This presentation will

investigate the rationale for sports drinks and the chemical, biological and behavioural factors that influence Dental erosion. It is important to observe the primary dentition for early signs of erosion and have a knowledge of the remineralizing techniques available. This lecture will look at the acids in sports and soft drinks and the literature establishing links between low pH drinks and erosion. Fluid loss and general guidelines for fluid needs during exercise will be discussed. Tooth damage other than decay is a huge and increasing problem in all age groups. At the conclusion of this lecture you will understand the mechanisms of tooth loss and the strategy to prevent such problems occurring in our patients.

Ray Padilla, DDS, FASD and Brett Dorney, BDS, FASD**


This hands-on course will focus on understanding the differences between outdated vacuum and modern pressure thermoforming fabrication of many appliances and their differences in performance and quality. The attendee will have hands-on familiarity with pressure machines and experience in-house indications, techniques, and designs of appliances such as implant stents, athletic mouthguards, model duplication impressions, temporary stents, clear orthodontic positioners and retainers, bleaching trays, fluoride trays, custom trays and denture bases, denture and partial repairs and other in house thermoformed appliances. In house fabrication allows for same day delivery and decreased lab bills.

At the conclusion of this workshop the attendees will have an understanding of the difference between vacuum and pressure fabrication of athletic mouthguards and other thermoforming appliances. They will see what is available in vacuum machines as compared to pressure machines; their costs and their differences in performance. They will have hands-on experience with pressure machines so an educated decision can be made on possible future purchases.

The attendee will be able to describe indications, techniques, and designs of pressure laminated mouthguards and other appliances such as implant stents, model duplication, temporary stents, clear positioners, orthodontic retainers, bleaching trays, fluoride trays, custom trays, denture bases, bruxism splints (hard and soft).

Brett Dorney, BDS, FASD

Dr. Brett Dorney is a general practitioner in suburban Sydney Australia with a passion for Sports Dentistry. Brett lectures widely displaying his technical and clinical expertise with mouthguards. He was deputy director of Dental services for the Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic games and team Dentist for the Rugby World Cup in 2003. He was a member of the Standards Australia Committee that produced guidelines for the care, use and fabrication of mouthguards. He is a

fellow of the Academy for Sports Dentistry and was president in 2006. Brett is a clinical lecturer for the University of Sydney and has presented undergraduate and post graduate courses since 1995.



David R. Farkouh, BSc., DMD, MSc., FRCDC

Dr. David Farkouh is a pediatric dentist working in private practice in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. He obtained his dental degree in 2000 from the University of British Columbia, Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. He then completed his masters degree in the specialty of Pediatric Dentistry in 2003 from the University of Toronto, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Dr. Farkouh is a fellow of the Royal College of Dentist of Canada.

and articles in Periodontal Surgery, Periodontal Osseous Grafting, Bone Regenerative Therapies, Treatment of Oral Facial Trauma, Wound Closure and the Impact of Smoking on Periodontal Disease. She conducts clinical research with dental lasers, oral antimicrobials, bone regeneration, local delivery drugs for periodontal tissue regeneration. 
Stephen Mills, DDS, FASD

1.) General Guidelines

- Use 11 point Times New Roman font.
- Do not use bold, italic or underline unless otherwise indicated.

2.) Heading section (title, author, affiliation)

- This entire section should be bold.
- Use a clear, concise title that reflects the study/survey etc.
- List the title first capitalizing only the first letter of the title and ending with a period.
- List authors' names-last name first followed by initials. Do not separate initials by periods or include authors' degrees.
- Separate authors' names by commas, with no period following final name.
- Place an asterisk after the presenter's name.
- List all affiliations following the last author's name and enclose them in parentheses. If there is more than one affiliation, separate them by semicolons.
- Include the city and state after each affiliation using uppercase postal abbreviations for state names (eg, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, MI).
- Do not place a period at the end of the Heading section

3.) Subhead section (if applicable)

Identify any supporting agency and grant number in 10 point italicized font, written as a complete sentence and begin as follows: Research supported by . . .

4.) Body

The body cannot exceed 200 words and should follow the usual sequence of purpose, methods, results and conclusions. Abbreviations should be defined on first mention.

Poster Presentations

Posters should be designed to fit a 4' (120cm) high by 6' (180cm) wide poster board. The poster session will last about 1 hour and presenters must be available for the entire viewing time.
