#### **MOUTHGUARD FABRICATION WORKSHOP**

**Speaker: Ray Padilla, DDS, FASD**

This hands-on course will focus on understanding the differences between outdated vacuum and modern pressure thermoforming fabrication of many appliances and their differences in performance and quality. The attendee will have hands-on familiarity with pressure machines and experience in-house indications, techniques, and designs of appliances such as implant stents, athletic mouthguards, model duplication impressions, temporary stents, clear orthodontic positioners and retainers, bleaching trays, fluoride trays, custom trays and denture bases, denture and partial repairs and other in house thermoformed appliances. In house fabrication allows for same day delivery and decreased lab bills.

At the conclusion of this workshop the attendees will:

- Have an understanding of the difference between vacuum and pressure fabrication of athletic mouthguards and other thermoforming appliances.
- See what is available in vacuum machines as compared to pressure machines, their costs and their differences in performance.
- Have hands-on experience with pressure machines so an educated decision can be made on possible future purchases.
- Be able to describe indications, techniques, and designs of pressure laminated mouthguards and other appliances such as implant stents, model duplication, temporary stents, clear positioners, orthodontic retainers, bleaching trays, fluoride trays, custom trays, denture bases, and bruxism splints (hard and soft).

Traumatic dental injuries (TDIs) are relatively common and oftentimes occur during sports activities. Splinting is recommended for many injuries including avulsions, luxations, root fractures and alveolar process fractures. Splinting of TDIs should be accomplished quickly and

easily, allow the patient to maintain good hygiene and be comfortable during the splinting period. This session will provide participants with the rationale and indications for splinting, recommended splinting times for the various TDIs, problem solving in challenging situations and experience with different materials and splint application.

Falls, accidents and sport-related injuries are the most frequent causes of dental trauma, with maxillary centrals being the most commonly injured teeth. Overall, the estimated prevalence of injuries among children is 30%. Patients can present with a wide variety of injuries ranging from crown or root fractures, to injuries to the supporting periodontal structure, including luxations and avulsions. Treatment is often complex, time consuming, expensive and requires multidisciplinary approaches such as endodontic and periodontal treatments, surgery, orthodontic movements as well as esthetic coronal restoration. This course aims to all oral health care providers, including general dentists, specialists, hygienists and staff members. New approaches for prevention, diagnosis and treatment of traumatized teeth will be thoroughly discussed and illustrated using advanced 3D technology for diagnosis and treatment planning.</p> <p>At the end of the course participants should be able to identify epidemiological and predisposing factors of dental trauma. Implement the most recent, state-of-the-art diagnostic and treatment modalities.</p> <p>Understand clinical applications of CBCT for diagnosis and treatment plan of dental and maxilla-facial injuries. Become familiar with dento-alveolar traumatic injuries and their complications. Be able to diagnose and treat post-traumatic root resorptions. Learn effective strategies for preservation and augmentation of alveolar ridge augmentation toward final prosthetic rehabilitation. Apply preventive measures. 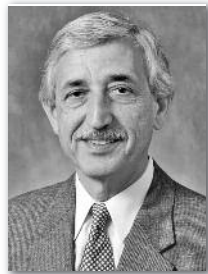
# Presenters . . . continued



## **Nestor Cohenca, DDS**

Dr. Cohenca received his dental degree from the National University of Asuncion, Paraguay. In 1994, he completed the endodontic program at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem *cum laude* and received the *Ino Sciaky* Best Graduate Student Award. He then served 11 years on faculty at the school while maintaining a private practice limited to endodontics. He is a diplomate of and was an

examiner for the Israel Board of Endodontics and past-president of the Israel Endodontic Society. From 2003 to 2005 he served as a clinical assistant professor and coordinator of Trauma and SportsDentistry at University of Southern California. Thereafter, Dr. Cohenca joined the University of Washington where he completed his endodontic certificate in 2008 and is currently an Associate Professor of Endodontics and Adjunct Associate Professor of Pediatric Dentistry. He serves as Director of Endodontics and Traumatology at the Center for Pediatric Dentistry and Seattle Children's Hospital. In 2010, Dr. Cohenca became a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and received an honorary membership to Omicron Kappa Upsilon National Dental Honor Society. As a full-time faculty member, he is active in research, teaching and lectures both national and internationally. He has published more than 45 peer-reviewed articles and serves as Associate Editor of the Dental Traumatology Journal and Board Director of the International Association of Dental Traumatology. Dr. Cohenca was one of the pioneers in the use of Cone Beam Computed Tomography in Endodontics and is considered one of the experts on this field. He is also an Adjunct Professor of Pediatric Dentistry with a strong background in Dental Traumatology and Endo-Pedo related topics. Dr. Cohenca maintains a private practice limited to Endodontics in Redmond, WA.



## **Anthony J. DiAngelis, DMD, MPH**

is Chief of Dentistry, Hennepin County Medical Center; Professor, Department of Primary Dental Care, University of Minnesota School of Dentistry. investigator for various insurance companies.

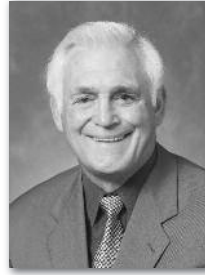

He would spend his entire career in Minnesota, playing 635 NHL regular season games for the North Stars through the 1977-78 season. A steady defenseman and sometime forward, he scored 21 goals in 1971-72 but was mostly known for his defensive, penalty killing.

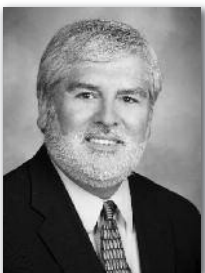


### Michael S. Nanne, DDS

### 1.) General Guidelines

- Abstract must be submitted as an attached Microsoft Word document to email address: [sportsdentistry@consolidated.net](mailto:sportsdentistry@consolidated.net)
- Use 11 point Times New Roman font.
- Do not use bold, italic or underline unless otherwise indicated.

### 2.) Heading section (title, author, affiliation)

- This entire section should be bold.
- Use a clear, concise title that reflects the study/survey etc.
- List the title first capitalizing only the first letter of the title and ending with a period.
- List authors' names-last name first followed by initials. Do not separate initials by periods or include authors' degrees.
- Separate authors' names by commas, with no period following final name.
- Place an asterisk after the presenter's name.
- List all affiliations following the last author's name and enclose them in parentheses. If there is more than one affiliation, separate them by semicolons.
- Include the city and state after each affiliation using uppercase postal abbreviations for state names (e.g., University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, MI).
- Do not place a period at the end of the Heading section

### 3.) Subhead section (if applicable)

Identify any supporting agency and grant number in 10 point italicized font, written as a complete sentence and begin as follows: Research supported by . . .

### 4.) Body

The body cannot exceed 200 words and should follow the usual sequence of purpose, methods, results and conclusions. Abbreviations should be defined on first mention.

## Poster Presentations

Posters should be designed to fit a 4' (120cm) high by 6' (180cm) wide poster board. The poster session will last about 1 hour and presenters must be available for the entire viewing time.
